NEIGHBORHOOD HERO HIGHLIGHTS

Keep up the great work team!

On January 24, 2022, Officer Yarbrough attempted to stop a speeding motorist which led to a brief high-speed chase. During the arrests, the Biscoe Police Department's K-9 Qito and Sgt Shamburger located and seized 57 grams of suspected crack cocaine, 30 grams of suspected fentanyl and 13 grams of suspected marijuana. Per DEA, 30 grams of fentanyl has the potential of killing up to 15,000 people which equals approximately 58% of the population in Montgomery County.



To this date, both canines have proven themselves to be fruitful to not only the Biscoe Police Department, but to nearly every agency in this county. So far, every agency except for Star Police, has requested assistance from our canines.

They have assisted in many investigations such as the search with Troy officers during a homicide investigation, they have conducted numerous vehicle searches, and tracking of suspects that fled on foot from the Montgomery Co Sheriff's Office, along with vehicle and article searches for Candor Police Department, not to mention a search for missing person(s) suffering from mental illness for Mount Gilead Police Department and an unknown number of searches for ourselves.

So far, our canines have located from trace amounts to trafficking amounts of illegal narcotics such as marijuana, methamphetamines, cocaine, heroin, fentanyl, and a large sum of cash during a search from a neighboring agency. And as many already know, the most recent bust that involved locating enough fentanyl to kill nearly 15,000 citizens was carried out after a brief high-speed chase. Without our canines, this fentanyl would have never been found at the time of the incident. Our canine program continues to prosper and has also become a big hit for the children at our local schools. From day one, this program has been beneficial and will continue make our communities a better and safer place for our town and our county.






