Guidelines for Grave Plots
Applies to All Sections of the Cemetery

NO OBSTRUCTIONS WILL BE ALLOWED THAT WILL PREVENT ACCESS OF MAINTENANCE OR UPKEEP OF GROUNDS

- <u>Head Stones</u>: Flowers and vases must be attached to headstones.
- Foot Markers: Foot markers must be flush to the ground.
- <u>Flat markers</u>: at ground level are allowed. <u>Burial vaults</u> are required.
- Benches are only allowed if it is a head stone on its own lot.
- No <u>fence</u> shall be placed or erected in or around said lots.


