EAST MONTGOMERY HIGH SCHOOL GETS NEW LIFE AS SCHOOL SAFETY TRAINING CENTER



"East Montgomery High School in Biscoe closed due to consolidation in 2020.

Next year, it will re-open as a facility to train law enforcement officers

and school staff to prevent and react to shootings."

BISCOE, N.C. — "State leaders gathered in Montgomery County on Tuesday to announce a new facility aimed at improving school safety in North Carolina. The former East Montgomery High School in Biscoe, near Jackson Springs, will be upfitted as a new, high-tech training center for law enforcement officers and educators. It's a partnership between the state's departments of education, justice, and public safety.

The school closed due to consolidation in 2020. The dust is thick on the floor of the old gymnasium. The halls around it are dark and a little creepy, with cobwebs and broken glass. It's kind of like a time capsule. But soon the former home of the Eagles will be renovated into a new home for the state's Center for Safer Schools. School resource and other law enforcement officers will be able to use the space for active shooter event simulations – learning how to respond in an actual school setting. Attorney General Josh Stein says it's essential for that training to be the best It possibly can be.

"Our heart breaks anytime there's a mass shooting, and particularly so when they're in schools, but that unfortunately is the world in which we live, and protecting our kids has to be our top priority," Stein said.

State Schools Superintendent Catherine Truitt says teachers, administrators and staff will also be able to use this space to get training in school behavioral threat assessment and de-escalation – to help them identify and head off potential threats before they become violent.

"Supplying the space for on-site crisis prevention training gives educators and support staff the skills and confidence they need to thrive in their roles," she said.

Truitt says school resource officers will also take those classes in addition to their active shooter training.


School and law enforcement officials say they hope the renovation will be complete and the facility will be open sometime next year."

Where did the Biscoe Bell logo originate?

We have had a lot of interest in the Biscoe Bell logo so we thought we would give a little history on its creation. As you know the Old Biscoe School holds a lot of history and memories for the Town. According to the 1951 Yearbook "The Golden Era" Biscoe High School was the oldest state-supported school in North Carolina.


As you can see from the photos from the 1951 and 1953 yearbooks, the school was crowned with a bell tower. The bell that was housed in the tower is now sitting to the right of Town Hall encased in a brick structure.

When Town Manager Brandon Holland was hired he wanted the town to have a logo separate from the Town Seal, which is used for official documents.



He and Town Clerk Laura Morton created the bell logo inspired and focused on the top of the bell tower. Instead of the bell tower being in a circle it was placed inside of bell shaped art.



§91.02 ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE OR IMPROPERLY CONTROLLED.

Any domestic animal which is found running at large or staked, hitched, or fastened in violation of the provisions of this chapter shall be seized and impounded by the Chief of Police or any person finding the same. The impounder may demand the payment of fees to cover any costs of seizure and impoundment.

DOGS

§91.15 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

At Large. Off the premises of the owner, and not under control either by leash, cord, chain, or otherwise.

Dog. Includes both male and female dogs.

Owner. Any person keeping or harboring a dog, and, for the purpose hereof, the head of a household shall be deemed to be the owner in respect to any dog or dogs owned, kept, or harbored by any person residing in the household and kept on the premises.

§91.16 RUNNING AT LARGE

It shall be unlawful for any person, being an owner of a dog as defined in §91.15, to permit the dog to run at large within the town at any time.



§91.02 ANIMALES CORRIENDO LIBREMENTE O CONTROLADOS INADECUADAMENTE.

Cualquier animal doméstico que se encuentre corriendo suelto o estacado, enganchado o atado en violacion de las disposiciones de este capítulo será capturado y confiscado por el jefe de policía o cualquier persona que lo encuentre. El incautador puede exigir el pago de tarifas para cubrir los costos de incautación y embargo.



§91.15 DEFINICIONES.

El propósito de este capítulo, se aplicarán las siguientes definiciones a menos que el contexto claramente indica o requiere un significado diferente.

LIBREMENTE. Fuera de propiedad de uno, y no bajo control ya sea por correa, cordón, cadena o de otro modo.

PERRO. Incluye perros machos y hembras.

PROPIETARIO. Cualquier persona que tenga o albergue un perro el dueño del hogar es responsable a cualquier perro o perros que posean, mantengan o alberguen cualquier persona que resida en el hogar y se mantenga en las instalaciones.
