#### What is CERRI?

The NC Main Street & Rural Planning Center's Rural Planning program (RPP) has developed a Community Economic Recovery and Resiliency Initiative (CERRI) to help small towns and rural communities recover from the economic impacts of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic and build local economies that are more resilient to future crises

Up to 24 local governments (three per Prosperity Zone) that have previously worked with the RPP on local strategic planning will participate in the initiative. RPP staff will develop an individualized Plan of Work for each community focused on two components: Community Economic Resiliency and Small Business Support. Through the initiative, the RPP will provide and/or make available additional services including analysis of current economic conditions and future opportunities, training and capacity building, formulation of implementation strategies, and project development and implementation assistance.

The RPP has applied for a CARES Act grant from the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) to support the CERRI. If approved, the grant will enable the RPP to hire consultants to provide each participating community with one of four types of professional services (Branding & Marketing, E-Commerce Development, Design Assistance, and Small Business Expansion & Recruitment) to help implement its Plan of Work.

#### What does this mean for Biscoe?

Biscoe has been picked, 1 out of 24 local governments to participate in the CERRI Project. This will help to build more capacity for local businesses in the town, in terms of helping them to build a sound management system, maintaining a strong governance, and strengthening their overall organizational infrastructure.


