Use Your Sewer System Wisely

We can help prevent most sewer back-ups and overflows with a progressive preventive maintenance program.

Sewer back-ups and overflows are often caused by improper materials such as fats, oils and grease being flushed into the sewer system. Fats, oils and grease are lighter than water and tend to accumulate at the top and side of sewer pipes building up until a blockage occurs.

Sanitary sewer systems are designed to handle three things: used water, human body waste, and toilet paper. Some simple things to prevent blockages and save money are shown below.

No Fats, Oil, Grease

PLEASE DO NOT

- **Pour oil and grease down drains**
- **Wash fryers/griddles/pot/pans and plates with water until oil and grease are removed**
- **Use hot water to rinse grease off surfaces**
- **Put food scraps down drains**

PLEASE

- **Put oil and grease in collection containers**
- **Remove oil and grease from kitchen utensils, equipment and food preparation areas with scrapers/towels/brooms**
- **Keep grease out of wash water**
- **Place food scraps in collection containers**

ARTICLE II

Section 1: Garbage: Garbage taken to mean the organic waste matter, both animal and vegetable from houses comprising chiefly of waste food and not including liquid that may be drained into the sewer. Garbage also includes tin cans, glass containers, bottles, paper and boxes. Recyclables should be placed in proper receptacles as provided.

Section 2: Rubbish: Rubbish shall be taken to include floor sweepings, old boots and shoes, discarded clothing, cardboard boxes and all such waste materials that ordinarily collect from a home or business. Rubbish must be placed in trash can for Monday's pick-up.

Section 3: Debris: Debris shall be taken to mean tree limbs, brush, leaves, etc.

Section 3-A: Debris:

The town will collect appliances and household furnishings. With the exception of any electronics. Example: TV's, computers, DVD players, microwaves, etc. The town will also not collect any construction or demolition material or remodeling material of any kind. Including: carpet, linoleum, sinks and toilets, cabinets, boards, plywood, wire, landscaping timbers, cardboard or cardboard boxes, tires, and batteries.

Section 4: It shall be the duty of every person owning, managing, operating, renting, occupying any dwelling, building or other place where garbage or rubbish accumulates or is produced to provide receptacles for such garbage or rubbish placed for collection by the garbage service. The following rules and regulations shall be observed.

Section 5: Residential receptacles shall be provided by the Town, which are purchased from Republic Services. Covers shall be kept on the receptacles at all times, except when being filled or emptied. Receptacles shall not have more than 32-gallon capacity each or less than 20-gallon capacity. Owners shall supply a sufficient number of such receptacles to hold the quantity of garbage or rubbish accumulated. All receptacles at all times must be so constructed and maintained, and so covered as to prevent the entrance of flies. Plastic garbage cans may be used, but owners are responsible for cleanup in case of ruptured bags. The Town of Biscoe will provide one receptacle per household. If an extra receptacle is needed, citizens may contact Town Hall at 428-4112 to request and extra receptacle. The monthly cost will be added to each month's utility bill.

Section 6: It is the duty of owners or occupants to set containers at curb side on designated pick up days. It is the responsibility of the homeowner or renter to replace any lost or stolen receptacle.

Section 7: It shall be unlawful for any person to burn any matter in garbage or rubbish receptacles or bulk containers. No liquid or semi-liquid matter will be collected by the town, nor should such matter be put in containers for removal by the garbage collector.

Section 8: It shall be the intention of the Town of Biscoe to provide collection service for garbage and rubbish to every residence in the Town; however, weeks in which holidays are observed by collectors, collection service may be once a week.

Section 9: Debris collection will be on a once-a-week schedule provided however that on weeks with certain holidays, or any town emergency that may occur no pickup may be provided.

Section 10: All tree limbs, trunks, etc, shall be cut in lengths no greater than 6 ft. and placed neatly in a stack facing in the same direction as the road and free of all other debris and rubbish. No one piece to weigh over fifty (50) pounds.

Pine straw and leaves will be collected when placed in neat rows next to the curbside away from obstacles such as trees, mailboxes, signs, and fire hydrants. Each pile should be free of limbs, rubbish and all other debris. If leaf rows do not meet all requirements they will not be collected.

Section 11: All large accumulations from lot clearings, tree removal or large quantities of tree and limb trimmings, building or home construction or repair shall be removed by contractor, home-owner or paid individual.

Section 12: It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, deposit in, sweep on, or rake into any street, sidewalk or gutter any leaves, trash, filth, rubbish, broken glass, tin cans, fruit peelings, refuse, ashes, wasted or loose paper. Such materials shall be accumulated as specified in this ordinance and placed in their respective places or proper receptacles as provided in this ordinance.

Section 13: Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of this misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days. Utilice el sistema de alcantarillado Sabiamente

Podemos ayudar a prevenir la mayoría de alcantarillado copias de seguridad y se desborda con un programa de mantenimiento preventivo progresivo. Alcantarillado copias de seguridad y desbordamientos son a menudo causados por materiales inapropiados tales como grasas , aceites y grasas que se lava en el sistema de alcantarillado. Grasas , aceites y grasas son más ligeros que el agua y tienden a acumularse en la parte superior y lateral de las tuberías de desagüe se acumulan hasta que se produzca un bloqueo.

Sistemas de alcantarillado sanitarios están diseñados para manejar tres cosas : agua utilizada , de desechos del cuerpo humano y de papel Trabajador . Algunas cosas simples para prevenir bloqueos y ahorrar dinero se muestran a continuación.

La mayoría de alcantarillado copias de seguridad se producen entre la casa y de alcantarillado de la ciudad principal; haciendo que el dueño de la propiedad responsable de corregir el problema. Evitar bloqueos evita facturas de plomería.

Sin grasas , aceite o grasa

POR FAVOR

- Ponga la grasa en contenedores apropiados
- Remueva el aceite y la grasa de utensilios de cocina, equipos, y areas de preparacion de comidas con espátulas/toallas/escobas
- Mantenga la grasa fuera de el agua de lavar
- Ponga los desperdicios de comida en contenedores adecuados

NO

- No tire aceite o grasa en los drenajes
- No lave con agua freidoras/planchas, ollas/cacerolas y platos hasta que el aceite y la grasa hayan sido removidos
- No use agua caliente para limpiar la grasa de las superficies
- No tire desperdicios de comida en los drenajes



ARTÍCULO II

Sección 1: Basura: La basura tomada en el sentido de la materia orgánica de residuos, tanto animales como vegetales de las casas que comprenden principalmente de los alimentos de residuos y sin incluir líquido que se puede drenar en la alcantarilla. La basura también incluye latas, envases de vidrio, botellas, papel y cajas. Reciclables deben ser colocados en recipientes adecuados según lo previsto.

Sección 2: Malo: La basura se tendrá que incluir basura del piso, viejas botas y zapatos, ropa desechada, cajas de cartón y todos los materiales de desecho que normalmente recogen de una casa o negocio. La basura debe ser colocada en el bote de basura para recoger del lunes.

Sección 3: Escombros: Escombros deberá interpretarse en el sentido de ramas de árboles, maleza, hojas, etc.

Sección 3-A: Escombros: La ciudad recogerá electrodomésticos y muebles de la casa. Con la excepción de cualquier electrónica. Ejemplo: televisores, computadoras, reproductores de DVD, microondas, etc. La ciudad tampoco se recogerá ninguna construcción o material de demolición o remodelación de material de ningún tipo. Incluyendo: alfombras, linóleo, fregaderos y lavabos, gabinetes, tableros de madera, madera contrachapada, alambres, maderas de jardinería, de cartón o cajas de cartón, neumáticos y baterías.

Sección 4: Será el deber de cada persona que posee, gestionar, operar, alquilar, ocupando cualquier vivienda, edificio u otro lugar donde la basura o la basura se acumula o se produce para proporcionar recipientes para tales basura o basura colocado para la recogida por el servicio de basura . Se observarán las siguientes reglas y regulaciones.

Sección 5: Residencial recipientes deberán ser proporcionados por la Ciudad, que se adquirió de Republic Services. Las cubiertas se mantendrán en los receptáculos en todo momento, excepto cuando se llena o vacía. Los recipientes no tendrá capacidad de más de 32 galones cada uno o menos de capacidad de 20 galones. Los propietarios deberán suministrar un número suficiente de tales recipientes para contener la cantidad de basura o basura acumulada. Todos los receptáculos en todo momento deberán estar construidos y mantenidos, y así como cubiertos para evitar la entrada de moscas. Botes de basura de plástico se pueden usar, pero los propietarios son responsables de la limpieza en caso de rotura de bolsas. La Ciudad de Biscoe proporcionará un receptáculo por hogar. Si se necesita una toma extra, los ciudadanos pueden ponerse en contacto con el Ayuntamiento al 428-4112 para solicitar y receptáculo extra. El costo mensual será añadido al proyecto de ley de la utilidad de cada mes.

Sección 6: Es deber de los propietarios u ocupantes de establecer contenedores en lado de la acera en recoger los días designados. Es responsabilidad del propietario o inquilino para reemplazar cualquier receptáculo de pérdida o robo.

Sección 7: Será ilegal para cualquier persona a quemar cualquier materia en la basura o basura recipientes o contenedores a granel. No importa líquido o semilíquido será recogido por la aldea, ni debe tal asunto se puso en contenedores para la eliminación por el recolector de basura.

Sección 8: Será la intención de la Ciudad de Biscoe para proporcionar el servicio de recogida de basura y basura a cada residencia en la Ciudad; Sin embargo, semanas en las que las vacaciones se observan por los coleccionistas, servicio de recolección pueden ser una vez a la semana.
