#### RESOLUTION In the Matter of Receiving Federal Funds Under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

**WHEREAS**, the State of North Carolina will be appropriating funding from the federal American RescuePlan Act (ARPA) to fund necessary Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the North Carolina General Assembly will provide for the distribution of funds to eligible municipal corporations, and townships; and

**WHEREAS,** before receiving a payment, a subdivision is required to adopt a resolution affirming that the subdivision will spend funding only on federal guidance related expenses as required under the ARPAct; and

WHEREAS, revenue received under the ARP Act will be kept in a separate fund and will not be comingled with other revenue; and

**WHEREAS** the Town of Biscoe will provide to the State of North Carolina and the US Treasury anyunspent balance of the funds received; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Town of Biscoe Council: That we do hereby request ARP Act funding to be distributed by the State of North Carolina and by adopting this resolution affirm that the revenue will only be used for the purposes prescribed in the ARPAct guidance as described in 31 CFR, Part 35, and any applicable regulations, for necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency connected with the COVID-19 pandemic, budget and certify such to the State Director of Office of Budget and Management and the Town of Biscoe Finance Director, and be it further

**RESOLVED** that the Town of Biscoe will comply with the procedure created by the North CarolinaGeneral Assembly and the US Treasury Department to receive funds under the act, and be it further

**RESOLVED** that this resolution is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and the financial integrity of the Town of Biscoe.

WHEREFORE this resolution is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect upon its passage.

- In accordance with the Town of Biscoe Code of Ordinances (Section 5-1-7) every application for a water connection (tap) and a sewer connection (tap) shall be made on a form provided by the Town, shall be signed by the applicant, shall be accompanied by the proper fee for making the connections, and a copy filed with the superintendent.
- Each customer applying for water service shall pay a connection fee in the amount fixed by the Board of Commissioners.
- If a bore or push under a street, sidewalk, roadway, or railroad tracks outside city limits is necessary, the applicant shall pay the cost of the bore (per invoice) before any services are made available.
- Schedules of current water and sewer rates are available to the public in the Clerk's office.
- Once a tap has been made and water service is extended to the customer, a minimum monthly charge is made, even if no water is consumed.
- Non-charging of the minimum monthly service charge may be requested, at which time, the meter box will be locked until reconnection is requested and a reconnection fee is paid.

#### **Construction Activities**

The original CDBG project is nearing completion. Once the sewer linework is completed, the contractor will notify the paving contractor. The paving work should be completed within two weeks once they start.

The Town is considering an amendment which will be submitted to NC Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) requesting permission to use CDBG funding from this project to replace the sewer lines along an outfall between Harris Street and Hyde Street. The Town will be working with LKC to complete an environmental review, revise the Engineering Report and will be scheduling a required public hearing to discuss the proposed amendment before submitting the project to NCDEQ for approval.
