On August 9th, 2021, Commissioner Kay C. Kinch was appointed as the new Mayor Pro Tem for the Town of Biscoe, in renewal of Mr. Gene Anderson. This will make Commissioner Kinch the first African American female Mayor Pro Tem, in Biscoe.

Additionally, Commissioner Kinch will also serve as a representative for the town, on the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. The ABC commission board is an independent body that meets once a week to administer, adjudicate, and enforce alcoholic beverage laws. The North Carolina ABC board aims to provide a uniform system to help control the sale, purchase, transportation, manufacture, consumption, and possession of alcoholic beverages across the state.

- Promote regional issues and cooperation among members.

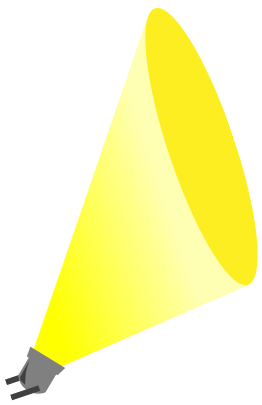

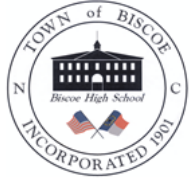


BISCOE CEMETERY

COMMUNITY NOTICE FOR BISCOE CEMETERY PLOT OWNER



No obstructions will be allowed that will prevent access of maintenance or upkeep of grounds.



After reviewing the above regulations, please visit your plot to make sure it is compliant.

The deadline for compliance is September 10, 2021.

After that date, Town Maintenance staff will clean up what does not meet regulations.

Rules for Biscoe Cemetery

Applies to All Sections of the Cemetery

- **Head Stones:** Flowers and vases must be attached to headstones.
- **Foot Markers:** Foot markers must be flush to the ground.
- **Monuments/sepulchral structures.**
- **Flat markers** at ground level are allowed. **Burial vaults** are required.
- **Benches** are only allowed if it is a head stone on its own lot.
- No **fence** shall be placed or erected in or around said lots.



BISCOE CEMETERY RULES & REGULATIONS

- First. That the said plot of land shall not be used for any other purpose than as a place of burial for the dead; and no trees within the lot or border shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of the Town.
- Second. That the Purchaser shall have the right to erect ONLY head stones, foot markers, monuments, and sepulchral structures. Flowers and vases must be attached to headstones. Foot markers must be flush to the ground. Flat markers at ground level are allowed. Burial vaults are required. No obstructions will be allowed that will prevent access of maintenance or upkeep of grounds. BENCHES ARE ONLY ALLOWED IF IT IS A HEAD STONE ON ITS OWN LOT.
- Third. No fence shall be placed or erected in or around said lots.
- Fourth. It shall be the duty of the Purchaser AT his own cost and expense to keep the said lot in good condition and to cause grass to be planted and maintained thereon and to keep the premises generally in a neat and orderly condition. THIS IS NOT REQUIRED UNLESS ORDERED OR REQUESTED BY THE TOWN. THE BISCOE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT WILL PERIODICALLY MONITOR ITEMS THAT ARE NOT ALLOWED BY THIS DEED.
- Fifth. The land herein conveyed shall be subject, in addition to the foregoing regulations, to all the provisions of the charter of the Town of Biscoe, and any amendments thereto, now in existence or hereafter to be made.

After reviewing the above regulations, please visit your plot to make sure it is compliant. The deadline for compliance is **September 10, 2021**. After that date, Town Maintenance staff will clean up what does not meet regulations.

WHEREAS, Army National Guard and Reserve Soldiers have and continue to make immense contributions on both the home front and abroad; and

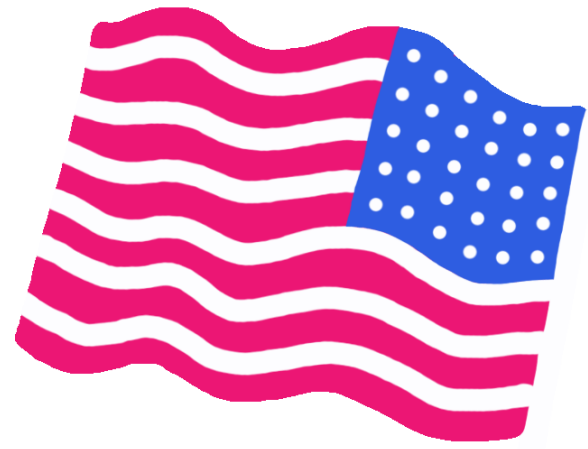
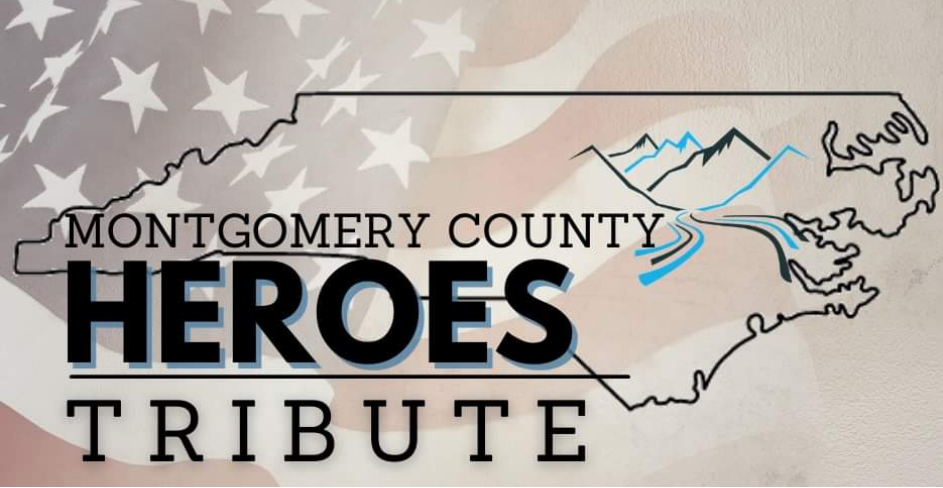
